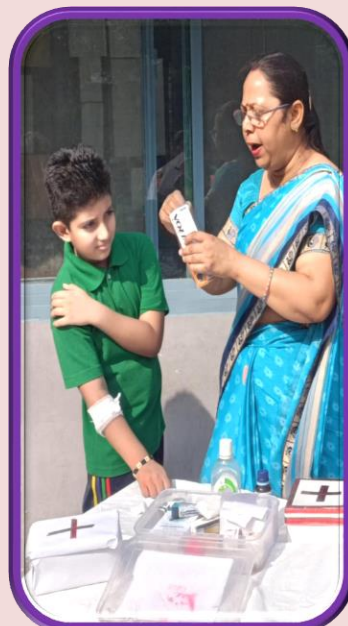

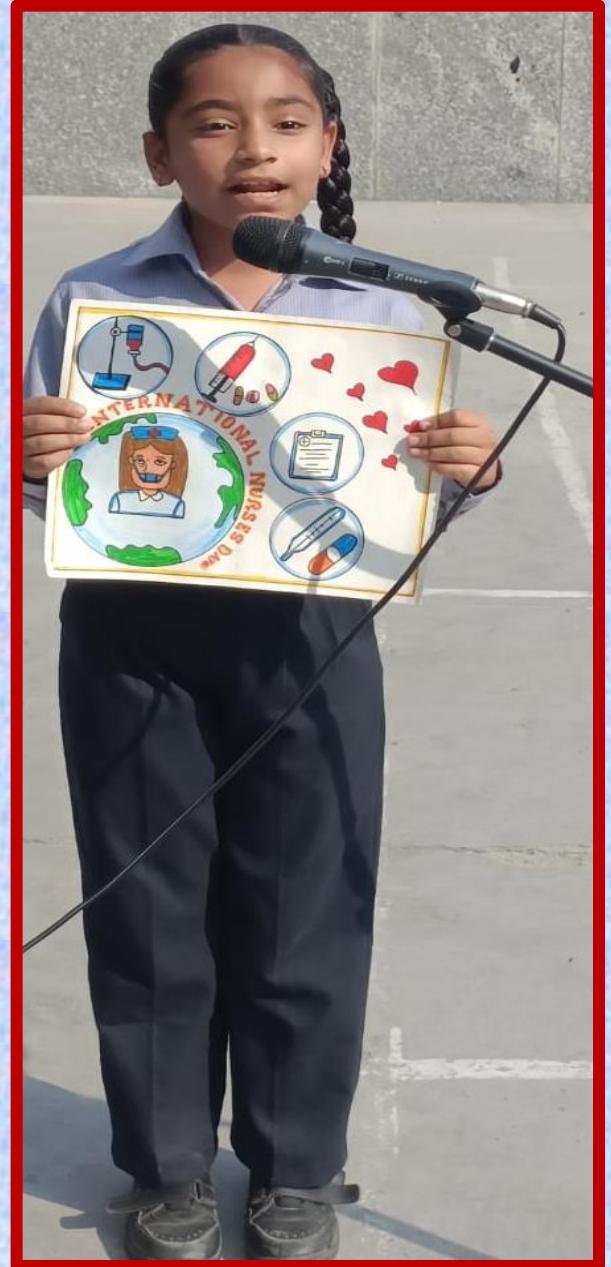








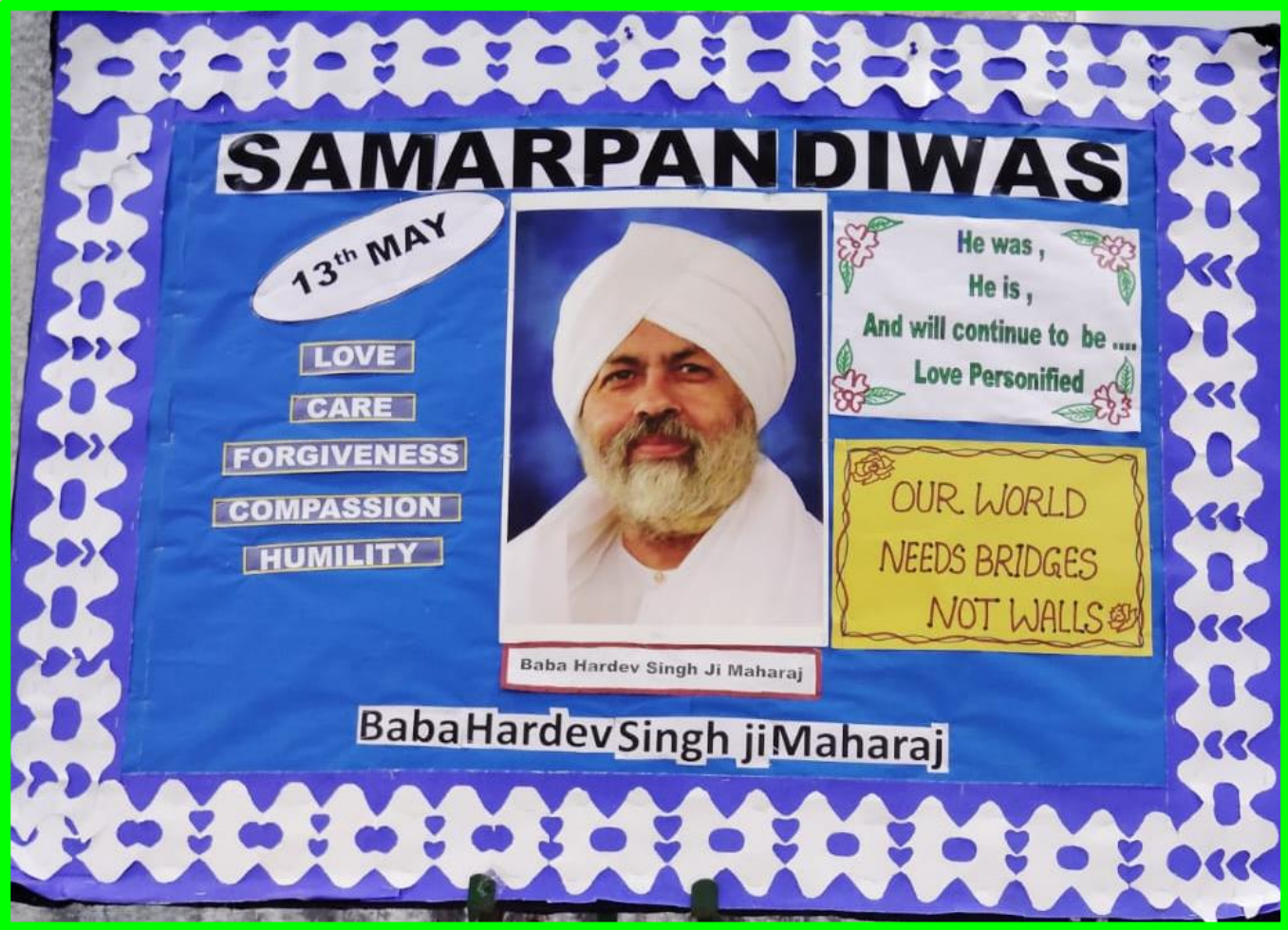
# INTERNATIONAL NURSES DAY

The winners were awarded the certificates of merit.





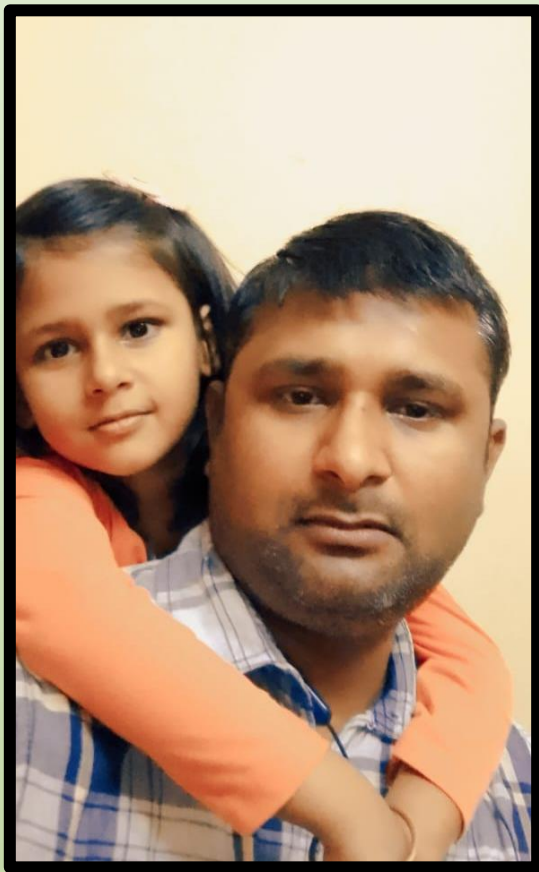
# Father's DAY



Father's Day, is celebrated every year on the second Sunday of June. The event was a beautiful expression of gratitude and affection from the students towards their fathers.

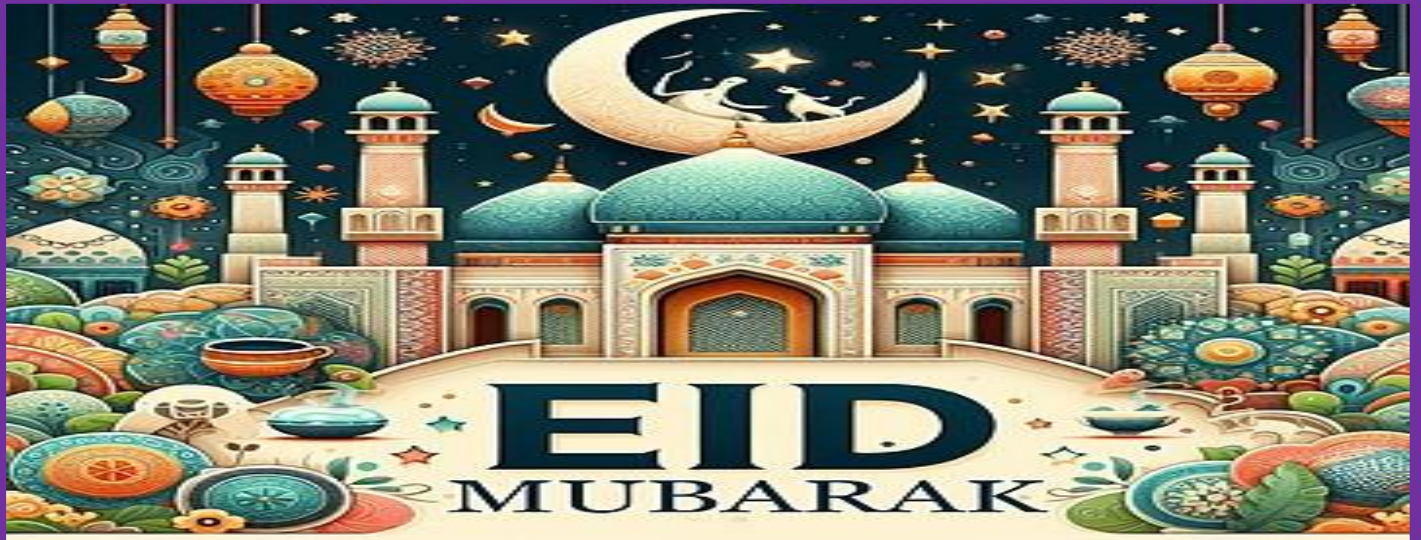

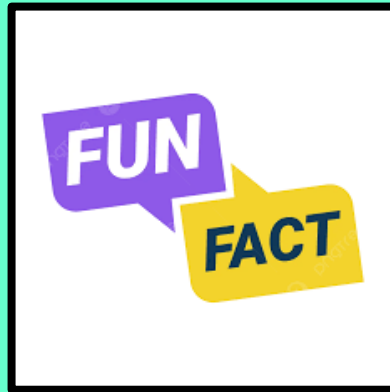

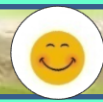
